

The baptism by John in the river Jordan would not have been easy for the first Christians to understand. On the face of it, this undergoing of a ritual of repentance did not seem to make sense. It can only have been included in the gospel tradition because it really happened. However, the account we have in Mark's gospel shows us that reflection upon this event led to an understanding of its great significance - as the defining inauguration of the mission of Jesus. It was the Father's authorization of the public role he was about to assume, and a prefiguring of the climax to which his career would lead - the Paschal Mystery - which he was later to look forward to as 'a baptism' (Lk 12.50).

A Letter from Larkin Architect

We are excited for the renovations and improvements that will be made to our church campus. Safety and accessibility was a major consideration to ensure that our building will respond to the needs of future generations. Please see the below letter from Larkin Architect:

In developing the design for the new elevator at Our Lady of Sorrows, there were several issues that led to the current arrangement and size.

The existing elevator dates back to 1989, and is in need of replacement. Parts are no longer available for this elevator, and its mechanism (key access) is onerous. It was identified that a replacement elevator was necessary.

In the selection of the new elevator, one primary concern was compliance with the new AODA (Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act - 2005) regulations, which will make adjustments to the building code, beginning January 1, 2015. These requirements necessitate a larger cab size, and larger landings to allow easier access to the elevator. Additionally, the city of Toronto is in the process of issuing accessibility guidelines which encourages public spaces to accommodate newer sized scooters and mobility aids.

Beyond a code compliant perspective however, the elevator selected was intended to provide a graceful and welcoming entrance to the church. Our Lady of Sorrows Parish is blessed with a vibrant parish community that includes many older parishioners with increasing mobility issues, and young families with strollers / buggies. Many parishioners with varying levels of physical and cognitive ability need better access. The intention of the design is to give access through a generous and welcoming entrance.

The elevator chosen is a Hydraulic Elevator with a 4000lb capacity. It will allow families with strollers/buggies to travel together. Individuals who are accompanied by a caretaker can travel simultaneously. Community members who rely on a variety of mobility devices including scooters and motorized wheelchairs will be able to comfortably use the elevator. Anyone who struggles with the stairs in the winter can have a welcoming entrance to the church, rather than a small, cramped, back entrance.

The existing elevator shaft could not accommodate any of the above requirements, either physically or spatially. With the new design, all members of the OLOS community will have a warm and welcome entrance to the community.

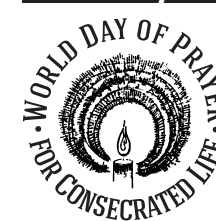

World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life Celebration

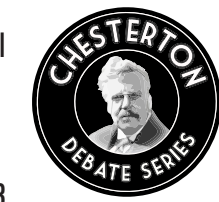
